# OUTCOMES MATTER

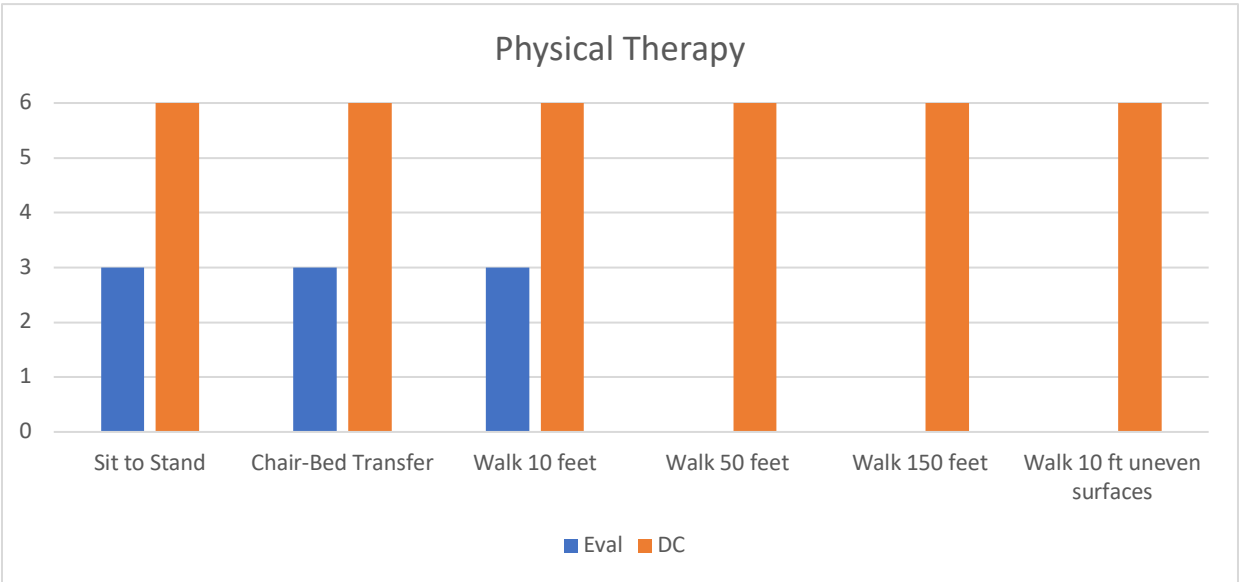


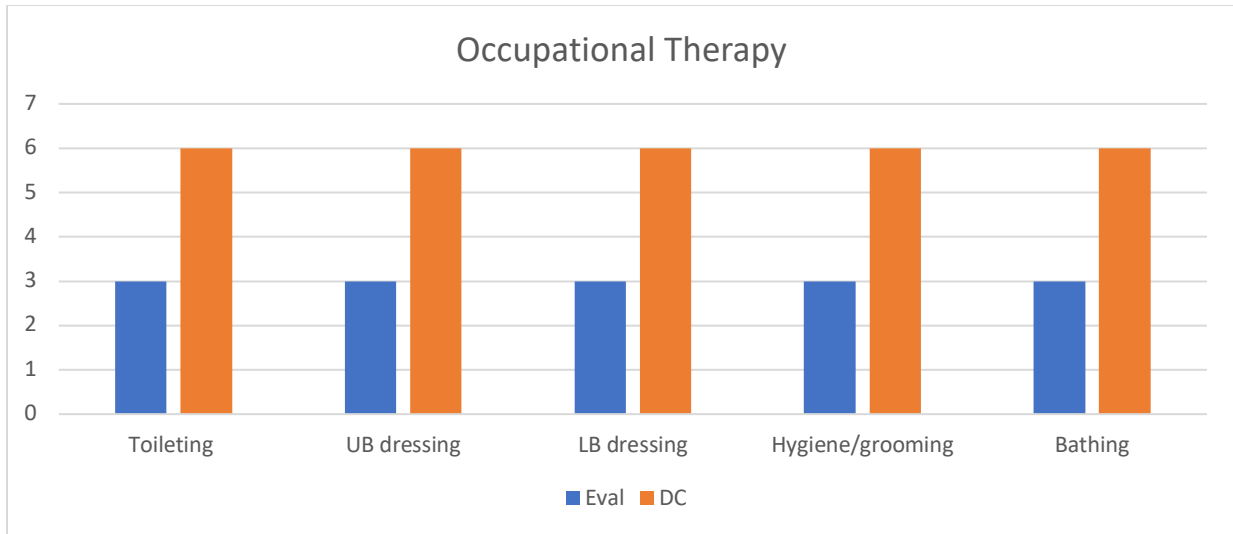
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Mr. Ho admitted to Red Oak Health and Rehab in March of 2024 due to a hospitalization for pneumonia. Mr. Ho was previously living with his family and was completely independent in all aspects of daily tasks such as getting dressing, bathing himself, cooking meals, and taking daily walks with his children. His family visited frequently while he was here, and he always had a smile on his face despite feeling ill.

Upon admission, he was evaluated by physical and occupational therapy in which a plan of care was established. He required moderate assistance for daily tasks such as dressing tasks, grooming tasks, toileting and bathing, as well as functional transfers and bed mobility. It was also noted that he was only able to ambulate about 20 feet with minimal assistance and an assistive device.

Mr. Ho worked extremely hard despite the language barrier. He smiled every time we walked into the room to start his therapy and enjoyed a few laughs as well. At the time of discharge, he was modified independent with all his daily tasks such as feeding, dressing, hygiene, toileting, bathing, and ambulation. He was able to ambulate over 150 feet with his 4-wheeled walker. Him and his family were very impressed with his progress in therapy and were so happy when he was discharged home. WAY TO GO!!





MDS Section GG Functional Scores
<b>06 - Independent</b> Completes the activity by him/herself with no assistance from a helper
<b>05 - Setup or clean-up assistance</b> Helper sets up or cleans up; patient completes activity. Helper assists only prior to or following the activity.
<b>04 - Supervision or touching assistance</b> Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard assistance as patient completes activity. Assistance may be provided throughout the activity or intermittently.
<b>03 - Partial/moderate assistance</b> Helper does LESS THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts, holds, or supports trunk or limbs, but provides less than half the effort.
<b>02 - Substantial/maximal assistance</b> Helper does MORE THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts or holds trunk or limbs and provides more than half the effort.
<b>01 - Dependent</b> Helper does ALL of the effort. Patient does none of the effort to complete the activity. Or the assistance of 2 or more helpers is required for the patient to complete the activity.
